On October 6th, the assembled board of the League of Utah Writers met and unanimously voted and approved an amendment to the League of Utah Writers Constitution. The Amendment created an option where if the Board wants the President and the executive team to serve in the same capacities a second year, and if the President and the executive team wants to serve a second year in the same capacities, then it would be made so through a vote at the board meeting.

\Rightarrow Oquirrh Writers


The Oquirrh Writers Chapter had a great quarter! Our members do us proud.


